These prices are open to conversation, and we would rather find a way to make this event work than have the price be a roadblock to our participation in an event. That said, we want to be transparent about how the funds from a concert impact our music and our contribution to the cause of freedom and justice.

We have a team on the road and in the office, gear insurance, performance insurance, vehicle expenses, travel expenses, gear purchases, and maintenance that we figure into this number.

We do not get paid by any of the organizations that we represent. We do not see any percentage of the money donated to The Exodus Road through our community. When David Zach goes overseas with The Exodus Road, he pays for his own flights and meals and contributes to the nightly expenses of undercover work. Concerts are how we fund all of our volunteer work in raising awareness, funding intervention, and aftercare.

AWARENESS AND PREVENTION

We contribute to preventing trafficking through our consistent advocacy in person and online. We are recruiting ordinary people into the fight against modern-day slavery and other justice-orientated movements through our music, and your event will commission the work that we are doing. It will enable us to continue writing music and creating art and content that nudges us all toward dangerous unselfishness.

INTERVENTION

We've recruited several individuals to join The Exodus Road's front-line teams. One former Master Sergeant in the Army's special forces moved his whole family to Asia for a year and raised his own funds to spy on criminal networks selling young boys and girls. He and five other individuals like him were recruited at our concerts. Sometimes, we can send spy gear and vehicles to the front lines because of concerts. David Zach can fund his personal contribution to The Exodus Road through the funds we make at our concerts. David believes in paying his own way because the people we're recruiting are also paying their own way and raising their own funds. To date, The Exodus Road has contributed to the freedom of over 1900 survivors of trafficking, and we've helped arrest over 1000 traffickers.

AFTERCARE AND REINTEGRATION

We display and sell our music and apparel at all of the events we are at. These sales are the main way we can support organizations that supply aftercare. All the apparel, t-shirts, and jewelry are

made by organizations that help restore and rehabilitate survivors of trafficking. These organizations give transitional employment, art therapy, trauma therapy, and restorative care to women and girls that have come out of life in the redlight districts. We also contribute to helping build resumes for survivors, breaking the cycle of exploitation for them and their children and creating a path to reintegrate into society. Agape International Mission, Rapha House, Sak Saum, and BYTAVI are some of the international organizations we support in this way.

Our goal at concerts is to inspire female students and women to get involved with local organizations responsible for this kind of work. We partner at events with The Safe House Project, a national aftercare organization, and many other local organizations. The network we've built helps us direct young women in a direction where they can volunteer or intern on their journey toward participating in freedom and justice.
